Long Beach College Promise Champion

Congressman Alan Lowenthal is being awarded the inaugural Long Beach College Promise Champion Award for his unwavering support of the Long Beach College Promise and his impressive legislative efforts to increase college completions during his tenure as a State Senator.

While in the California Senate, he championed the Long Beach College Promise Partnership Act in 2011 to help Long Beach Unified students better transition to Long Beach City College. He also authored and passed the Student Success Act of 2012 to increase access and success in California community colleges by providing effective orientation, assessment and placement, counseling, and other education planning services to help more students earn degrees and certificates.

Congressman Lowenthal currently represents California's 47th Congressional District after serving two decades as a Long Beach City Council member and California legislator, where his dedication to common-sense bipartisan solutions earned him a reputation among his colleagues and constituents as one of the most respected and effective legislators in both Long Beach and Sacramento. He is also an emeritus professor of psychology at CSULB.

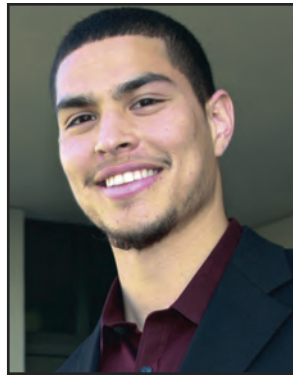
